

## **Report for May 2021**

### **1. Scholarship Scheme.**

We contacted school teachers and authorities where the beneficiaries are schooling. They are behaving well and working hard academically. Their guardians and or parents are very appreciative. We continue to register applications for consideration next academic year.

### **2. Visually Impaired**

We visited Mrs. Anna Acha Engonwei and advised her to be putting on the glasses provided by CHHA. Mr. Edwin Nsah is doing fine and is very appreciative. Mr. Nelson Fongoh of Mbufung Bali has been recommended for a grant of food stuffs. This will be done as soon as we can make it there.

### **3. Teenage Moms**

- a. Miss Ngwe Jacentha is doing well on her trade. She works with her trainer and also does small works around the village. We established a declaratory judgment from the High Court Mezam for her and the process of establishing a birth certificate and an ID Card is in progress. Her child had health problems but mother and child are all doing fine now. She has completed her training for treating nails and eyelids
- b. The first baby born after CHHA prenatal support came in early May 2021 from Bali Nyongha by Miss Blessing Akwewo. She had assistance from elsewhere to pay her delivery costs.
- c. We communicated often with Mrs. Loveline of the Catholic Health Center Bali who is in charge of the Prenatal Clinic. The girls who benefited from the Prenatal Support are all doing fine.
- d. The teenage moms around Nkwem Bamenda III, be considered next month, hoping the Covid situation improves in Cameroon

#### **4. Single Moms**

- i) Nchang Marice Noel is not regular at her tailoring training. She claimed she had to cultivate maize and beans to support herself but after the farming season, she has not been regular. We have agreed to suspend her apprenticeship fees as from June till she can be more committed.
- ii) Mrs. Fenoh Vera Acha who benefited most from the Scheme-Full tuition for two kids, food stuffs, clothing, and books has been very disappointing. She signed out money to trade in oil but has not allowed CHHA volunteers to meet her and see the oil trade. We learned later on that she was selling fruits at Hospital Round About Bamenda. When we got to the place we couldn't find her. The children are regular at school and we are observing to see whether she will present the report cards to us as agreed.

#### **5. Lonely Elders**

We did not visit any lonely elders this month because of Covid restrictions. After our vaccinations and lessening restrictions we will meet them next month.
