Miss Frinwie Jaoyceline is 18 years old. Got pregnant while in college. Will engage in tailoring as from April. Hails from Nkwen .



CHHA volunteer accompany Mme Anna Acha Enongwei to Mbingo Baptist hospital for check up. Mme Anna lost her husband five years ago. She later lost her sight because she wasn't able to pay for the surgery she was due.

Mme Azah Elizabeth is the Nurse in charge of the Bali Urban Intergrated Health Center. She welcomed the volunteers and promised total collaboration with her entire staff. She has had many girls who can't start or continue prenatal clinic because of poverty.

He has problems of accommodation and no job since his works are voluntary. To encourage him to assist others with similar problems CHAA is giving him a grant for upkeep.

Marie Noel dropped out of school because of her pregnancy. She hopes to be able to help her child and give her good education.

We got Ngwe into the CHAA project for single vulnerable moms to learn the treatment of nails and hair plaiting. Here in the picture her trainer carries the baby.
