

FIRST END OF YEAR REPORT

SCHOLARSHIP

During the academic year 2020/2021, 43 students and pupils benefited from the CHAA scholarship scheme. This first attempt by the organization was exposed to many flaws thus:

1. Late start of the sponsorship
2. Limited coverage
3. Screening inadequacies

For the academic year 2021/2022, we tried to work on the major weaknesses outlined above. A commission was established to receive and make recommendations as early as July. Luckily the founders made funds available earlier.

We have great optimism that by February 2022 we would have sponsored, supported and/or produced birth certificates for about 200 pupils and students.

We have also widened our sphere of support to include Njinikom, Bafut and Dschang of the West Region of Cameroon.

TEENAGE MOMS

The first girls we earmarked for the teenage project of learning a trade or return to school did not continue for various reasons. At Nsongwa 3 of them refused to comply with preliminary guidelines we gave them on conduct. Ngwe Jacentha was sponsored to learn nails decoration and plaiting. After receiving the package for the nails, she refused to continue with plaiting. We established her a birth certificate and nationality to enable her obtain a national identity.

Nchang Marie-Noel, who was learning dressmaking abandoned work and is roaming the streets searching for more children.

Four teenagers were assisted for prenatal care in Bali.

Two babies were born in the scheme with full antenatal care.

Two girls from Menteh are outstanding in their behavior. Binwie Joey was enrolled at Menda Evening School after she passed her ordinary levels.

Joyceline Frinwie is doing exceptionally well at the dressmaking shop. Each time we surprised her, she is always present.

Two single parents have been programmed for business startup.

LONELY ELDERS

The lonely elders are 3 from Nsongwa: Ma Pauline Neh, Mama Lucy Ngum, and Mama Monica Bih. There is one from Mbatu Mama Magdalene Shulli, and one from Nitop – Mama Anastasia. From New Bell we have Acha Anna, Elizabeth Afouka, one from Dschang and 03 from Bali giving a total of 11.
